

Dear Friends,

I have been asked a few times recently how churches (big and small) can revitalize, grow, and become more sustainable into the future. I need to give you the bad news first: there isn't a magic pill or a special prayer, or even a book with guidelines that will solve this problem. Now to the good news: we need to do some challenging work. I know...you thought the good news was going to be easy! (Remember, no magic pill!)



I read an article that was interesting (https://justiceunbound.org/a-mega-change-is-needed/ and connects well to what I had been reading in Graham Standish's latest book, *Preaching to Those Walking Away*. We need to recognize what is attracting people to the churches where they are going. We also need to recognize that a considerable percentage of people are not connected to any church.

What sets us apart from others? Is that good or harming our attendance? What do we offer that people at home might want to be involved with? Sometimes getting the answers is hard. Sometimes, it is dealing with what to do to move us toward the answers that is hard. We are all in this together. All mainline denominations are shrinking. I looked at our church membership numbers over the past five years, and not one of our churches is growing considerably. Not one.

If you want to hear from Graham about what he and the session of Calvin Church (Zelionople, PA) accomplished in church revitalization, register, and join us for his September 26 program (hosted at Worthington Presbyterian church, \$5 for lunch). Read the article I mentioned. Maybe challenge your session to attend a mega church one week and come back with ideas. It's not all about the music, friends! Let's see if we can figure out a way forward together!
