WHAT IS IT AND WHAT DOES IT DO? The General Assembly consists of commissioners elected by presbyteries. Half of the commissioners will be ruling elders, half will be teaching elders. Few will ever have been commissioners to the General Assembly before, but most will have served in one of the other governing bodies of our church: the session, which provides care and oversight of a local congregation; the presbytery, which provides care and oversight of a group of congregations; or the synod which provides care and oversight of several presbyteries. ### **Discernment & Design Q&A**

**Is it appropriate to use the Church Development Fund in support of this plan?** As approved by
Presbytery, the purpose of the Church Development Fund

(CDF) is "to advance church development in the Presbytery, consistent with the mission of Christ within the bounds of the Presbytery in accordance with Scripture and the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA), the mission and vision statement of the Presbytery, and the ongoing ministry strategy of the Presbytery and its Commissions."

Information gathered through Phase 1 of the Discernment & Design process identified a number of ways in which the churches of the Presbytery need assistance in developing their ministries and also ways in which Presbytery commissions need support for the work with which they are entrusted. The Discernment & Design proposal uses a variety of funding sources, including the CDF, to enhance our ministry.

There is a sufficient balance in this fund to support the initiatives of the proposed staffing and commission model for a period of years, with the understanding that in year 3 of the new structure the use of CDF funds will be reconsidered, and adjustments made, if needed.

#### What is the role of the Presbytery Council in the new structure?

The purpose of the proposed Presbytery Council will be to organize the life of the Presbytery through vision, planning, budgeting, and accountability. It will be the responsibility of the Council to guide the ship – to ensure that policy, operational, and financial decisions are consistent with the mission and priority of the Presbytery.

What will happen to the Ministry Initiative Board? All commitments that have been made by the Ministry Initiative Board will be honored moving forward, while the grant-making responsibilities of that Board will be relocated to the Commission on Ministry and the Commission on Justice, Outreach, and

Education. Those commissions will have authority to make grants consistent with their responsibilities and with the priorities of the Presbytery.

The Presbytery of Scioto Valley includes 86 churches with a membership of 12,817 (updated March 20, 2023). Surrounding the metropolitan center of Columbus, Ohio, the Presbytery extends northward to Marion, east to Newark, west to London and southward to the Ohio River. The southern portion of the presbytery is distinguished by an Appalachian culture, where there are many small towns and much rugged open



country. Scioto Valley Presbytery is represented in 21 Counties: Athens, Delaware, Fairfield, Fayette, Franklin, Gallia, Hocking, Jackson, Knox, Lawrence, Licking, Madison, Marion, Meigs, Morrow, Pickaway, Pike, Ross, Scioto, Union, and Vinton.

**Commission for Church Professionals News, Updates and Upcoming Events. Purpose:** To foster the faith and vitality of those who are called to professional ministry pastors, associate pastors, designated pastors, interim pastors, honorably retired teaching elders, stated supply, temporary supply, teaching elders in specialized ministry, inquirers, candidates, commissioned ruling elders, certified Christian educators, and ministers at large.

PC(USA)'s Synod of the Covenant offers up LaRue's clues for preaching. Retired homiletics professor the Rev. Dr. Cleophus J. LaRue Jr. is the most recent guest on 'Equipping Preachers'

LOUISVILLE — When the **Rev. Dr. Cleo LaRue** hears a sermon, he's listening for four things:

- Was the biblical text central to the sermon?
- Was there a controlling thought or identifiable sermonic idea, or was it, as LaRue calls it, "pearls without a string?"
- Could you follow the sermon with your listening ear? "I am opposed to long quotes," the former homiletics professor at

Princeton Theological Seminary said. "It takes it out of your voice and makes it difficult to hear and follow with your listening ear. You have to write in conversational tone to engage your congregation."

 Did the sermon make a claim on your life? "Are you preaching because you have something to say," he asked, "or are you preaching because you have to say something?"

LaRue appeared online earlier this month as part of the Synod of the Covenant's **Equipping Preachers** series. His nearly 90-minute webinar, hosted by the synod's executive, the Rev. Dr. Chip Hardwick, was entitled "A Refresher Course on Sermon Preparation." It's available **here**.


