I talked to the session record review team, and I was told that about 50% of our clerks brought their records for review. I cannot wait to see the final list of those who have not brought their records in. And I wonder why that is... was it an inconvenient time to get to the review locations? were the locations not favorable?

I also looked at how many of our churches did not respond to the annual survey of pastor salaries. That was submitted early in the year, usually by

email, but some by regular mail. And I wonder why some did not respond. Was the form too difficult to fill out? Did it not get to the right person for completion?

Part of me is cynical and says in answer to the above questions - people just don't care. And that saddens me. Really saddens me.

I chose to be Presbyterian. Yes, my parents baptized me as a baby in a Presbyterian church and that is where I attended Sunday school and youth group. However, as an adult, I also belonged to a Lutheran church, and my grandparents were Lutherans. I had friends who were Methodist and Roman Catholic. I made a choice to return to my Presbyterian roots when I was called to ministry. I love the theology behind what we do. I love the polity that guides us. I love the connections between churches, between presbyteries, between synods. And I am just geeky enough to love the General Assembly...enough to go and volunteer even when my presbytery was not the host!

So, it really does sadden me to think that people may not care to respond to information requests from the presbytery office. We have certain tasks that we are required to do by the Book of Order, and so we need your church's participation to do our own tasks. I wonder...are you glad to be Presbyterian? Do you know if your fellow congregants know why they are Presbyterian? Have a cup of warm soup on this chilly day...and let me know your thoughts...

for this age of boys and girls. Once the Bag has ten coats in it, the Bag is taken upstairs to await pickup by a school the next day at **The Big Pick-Up**.

### **Discernment & Design O&A**

## Is it appropriate to use the Church Development Fund in support of this plan?

As approved by Presbytery, the purpose of the Church Development Fund (CDF) is "to advance church development in the Presbytery, consistent with the mission of Christ within the bounds of the Presbytery in accordance with Scripture and the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA), the mission and vision statement of the Presbytery, and the ongoing ministry strategy of the Presbytery and its Commissions."

Information gathered through Phase 1 of the Discernment & Design process identified a number of ways in which the churches of the Presbytery need assistance in developing their ministries and also ways in which Presbytery commissions need support for the work with which they are entrusted. The Discernment & Design proposal uses a variety of funding sources, including the CDF, to enhance our ministry.

There is a sufficient balance in this fund to support the initiatives of the proposed staffing and commission model for a period of years, with the understanding that in year 3 of the new structure the use of CDF funds will be reconsidered, and adjustments made, if needed.

### What is the role of the Presbytery Council in the new structure?

The purpose of the proposed Presbytery Council will be to organize the life of the Presbytery through vision, planning, budgeting, and accountability. It will be the responsibility of the Council to guide the ship – to ensure that policy, operational, and financial decisions are consistent with the mission and priority of the Presbytery.

### What will happen to the Ministry Initiative Board?

All commitments that have been made by the Ministry Initiative Board will be honored moving forward, while the grant-making responsibilities of that Board will be relocated to the Commission on Ministry and the Commission on Justice, Outreach, and Education. Those commissions will have authority to make grants consistent with their responsibilities and with the priorities of the Presbytery.

**Commission for Congregational Life (CCL). Purpose:** To promote and nurture healthy, faith-filled relationships within and among congregations and the presbytery through facilitation, communication, and coordination.

The Presbytery of Scioto Valley includes 86 churches with a membership of 12,817 (updated March 20, 2023). Surrounding the metropolitan center of Columbus, Ohio, the Presbytery extends northward to Marion, east to Newark, west to London and southward to the Ohio River. The southern portion of the presbytery is distinguished by an Appalachian culture, where there are many small towns and much rugged open



country. Scioto Valley Presbytery is represented in 21 Counties: Athens, Delaware, Fairfield, Fayette, Franklin, Gallia, Hocking, Jackson, Knox, Lawrence, Licking, Madison, Marion, Meigs, Morrow, Pickaway, Pike, Ross, Scioto, Union, and Vinton.

**UPDATE:** The sale of the Columbus St. Andrew Presbyterian Church property is proceeding. We are selling to the Columbus Assembly of God who will be using this location for a Brazilian congregation. We had anticipated closing on the sale this week, but we hit a small "speed bump" when Franklin County would NOT accept the legal description. from when we bought the property back in the early 1960's. The County insisted on a new survey and legal description. The "field work" for the survey was completed this week and the surveyor is now in the process

of preparing a new legal description and getting it approved by the County. According to our attorneys, we hope to have the County's approval. of the new legal description by mid-month. SO - barring any other speed bumps- we should be able to close either just before Thanksgiving or - **MORE REALISTICALLY** - early the following week (Tuesday or Wednesday after Thanksgiving). As the team continues to close the St. Andrew Presbyterian Church, we have learned that the buyers (another church) are not interested in the ORGAN. Consequently, we have a **Johannus Organ** available to anyone needing a new organ for their sanctuary. As the former members of St Andrew can attest, this organ is a fine musical instrument and would be an asset to another church.

The former music director of St. Andrew suggests that it would need to be professionally removed from St. Andrew and professionally transported and installed in its new home and should be provided with regular servicing by a qualified technician. Given the high quality of this organ he believes that such actions would be appropriate, and that the organ will serve its new congregation well.





Commission for Nurture and Outreach (CNO) News, Updates and Upcoming Events. Purpose: To provide and nurture educational, connectional, and outreach opportunities, which promote growth in discipleship, encourage congregational mission partnerships, and support special areas of ministry, such as peacemaking, youth and campus ministry.

**Given Issue 1** on the election ballot next week, we might remember our church's stance on abortion. In 2002, the PCUSA General Assembly approved by a vote of 348-38, that women and pregnant people are full moral agents, created in the image of God, and it supports their moral capacity to decide whether to continue or end any given pregnancy. It also denounces attempts to prevent people from receiving essential health care and rejects attempts at all levels of government to reduce, limit or eliminate access to contraceptive and abortion care.
