Dear Friends,

At the time that Jesus was born, we are told that the Romans were conducting a census, a count of all the men in each territory. We know that often they counted men, so they knew how many potential soldiers were available or how many taxable units existed.

In the church today, we still do a kind of census. Every year, we ask the clerks of session to tell us how

many members are in each congregation. Thankfully, we are not counting how many soldiers we have!

We do know that numbers are not the only determining factor of the health of a church, yet it is an important historical number that has been collected annually for decades. The challenge becomes what happens with the numbers. Depending on the size of your congregation, you MAY get extra commissioners for presbytery meetings. Depending on the size of your congregation, you may be eligible for some grants but not others.

The number of members your clerk of session reported at the end of last year (2022) will be the number used to calculate how much per capita your congregation needs to send to the presbytery, synod, and General Assembly. Sometimes that number from 2022 can be WAY off from what you ended 2023 with. (We do have a per capita relief policy...you can find it on the.)

Every session has the responsibility to review their membership records annually. We find people that have moved away, began attending another church in the neighborhood, or even those who died and yet were never marked as such in the records. This cleaning of the rolls is not an easy project, but it is an important one. Do you know if your session has cleaned the rolls lately? Do you know if the clerk of session is completing the annual "census" we call statistical reporting?

We count (pun intended) on everyone working together to provide a clear picture of our churches in this presbytery. Can we count (ha!) on you?

Updates from the Commission for Presbytery Operations Jim Hines, Chair

Search Committee for new Associate General Presbyter. The search is on for our new Associate General Presbyter. The position has been posted on Church Leadership Connection (CLC) part of the General Assembly, and is being communicated to the mid-level council leaders' group. The search committee is composed of representatives from the CPO-HR team and representatives from the Commission for Congregational Life (CCL).

If you or someone you know is interested in applying, please go to CLC https://clc.pcusa.org/mdp/11109/view/ to indicate your interest. Currently, the search committee plans to start reviewing applicants in January with an ambitious goal of having a candidate ready for the February Presbytery meeting.

The IRS has announced the **standard mileage rate for 2024: 67 cents per mile,** up 1.5 cents from 65.5 cents in 2023. Issued in Notice 2024-8, on Dec. 14, 2023, it covers the business use of a vehicle (cars, vans, pickups, and panel trucks) and will come into effect Jan. 1, 2024.
