Impact of the Christmas Joy Offering: Read Judi's Story

Dear Friends,

Many of us grew up studying the Westminster Catechism, and we usually can recall what question 1 is...What is the chief end of humanity? and the answer is...Humanity's chief end is to glorify God and to enjoy God forever. The dictionary says glorify is to praise or honor someone to an extreme degree, and enjoy is taking delight or pleasure in. So, the ultimate purpose of

humanity is to praise God to an extreme degree and take delight in God forever. Praising God to an extreme degree does not mean we have to sing louder (although we can), raise our hands when we pray or sing (although we can), or delivering or sitting through a longer sermon (!!!).

Praising God to an extreme degree might mean we take it more seriously to allow praises to flow to God (just like at our Thanksgiving tables, when we said special thanks!) Praising God to an extreme degree allows us to take delight in God! Finding joy in loving God is an ambiguous thing to describe. It is one of those things the kids say is "iykyk" – if you know, you know. Some people describe joy as a feeling of bubbles inside us, like when kids would blow bubbles and get so excited seeing the rainbow of colors on the bubble as it floated toward the ground. Others describe joy as a state of happiness that does not quit, like a big, long smile.

During Advent, we have one candle that is pink – the candle for joy. The practice of using a rose (or pink) candle was to acknowledge the shift in our season of waiting from that of penitence (sorrow, regret, repentance) to the focus on celebration (to celebrate that Christmas is near). It is that time in the season when we also should remember our call to praise God and take joy in knowing we are God's own. We can, and should, allow that joy to displace all the grouchiness that might be invading us after dealing with stores being crowded, to-do lists not getting done, and the sadness of loss being so overwhelming.

As we close in on Christmas Eve services and Christmas Day, we pray that you will find joy beyond measure, joy that drives you into praising God to an extreme degree and delighting in knowing whose you are! Merry Christmas from us to you!

Commission for Presbytery Operations Update, Jim Hines, Chair.

At the Presbytery meeting, I mentioned that the Commission for Presbytery Operations was working to see if we could put together an "insurance pool" for the churches in our Presbytery.

We are aware that several churches have learned that their insurance is being cancelled for no apparent reason or that their premiums are going up significantly. To date, we have been addressing these issues on a "one-off" basis – working with individual churches to help with their insurance. To put together an "insurance pool" to benefit all the PSV churches, we need to collect information on each church (age, type of roof, boilers, etc.). We also need to know if you have written policies for "Sexual Harassment" and for "Child and Youth Protection" since one of our primary insurance carriers requires this a condition of providing insurance coverage.
